

Doris Street, Picnic Point - Pedestrian & Streetscape Upgrade

At **High End Civil**, we believe every project is a chance to make a lasting difference in people's lives. In partnership with **Canterbury-Bankstown Council**, we proudly delivered the **Doris Street, Picnic Point Pedestrian & Streetscape Upgrade (Project Q232-25)**. This important neighbourhood project has revitalised a local street into a safer, greener, and more accessible space that families, school children, and residents can enjoy for generations to come.

The Doris Street upgrade was designed to modernise a busy local road and create a safe pedestrian connection in Picnic Point. Serving local households, commuters, and the wider Canterbury-Bankstown community, the works were completed within Council's program timeframe and included six weeks of post-construction landscape maintenance to ensure the new green spaces flourished.

Project Deliverables

- Over 560 m² of new concrete footpaths
- 95 metres of new kerb and guttering
- 91 m² of upgraded vehicular crossings
- New kerb ramps with 24 tactile ground indicators
- 18 m² of traffic-calming speed humps and line marking
- Six feature trees and landscaped garden beds
- Responsible waste management: 85 tonnes recycled

Community Impact & Lasting Legacy

The project has transformed Doris Street into a safer and more welcoming place. Children walking to school, parents with prams, and seniors with mobility aids can now move with greater confidence along wide, smooth, and well-lit crossings. The addition of new turf, feature trees, and landscaped areas has refreshed the street's character, while traffic-calming measures and clear line marking ensure safer journeys for all road users.



Safety First

Licensed traffic controllers, barriers, and comprehensive signage protected both community and construction teams throughout delivery

Recycled glass in asphalt, protected mature trees, and 85 tonnes of recyclable material responsibly managed

Seamless coordination with Council, residents, and transport providers minimised disruption during works

Environmental Excellence

We embraced sustainable practices throughout delivery, using recycled materials and protecting the local environment. Our comprehensive approach included erosion and sediment controls to safeguard surrounding areas, whilst our waste management strategy saw **85 tonnes of material recycled** and **256 tonnes of general waste** processed responsibly through Council facilities at Bransgrove Road.

The careful preservation of mature trees and integration of new feature plantings demonstrates our commitment to enhancing, rather than replacing, the area's natural character. This approach ensures the community benefits from both improved infrastructure and enhanced environmental amenity.
